2. What are some things that can stop you from admitting someone has sinned against you? How can the consequences of a wrong done against you be worse or bigger than the offense itself?
3. Why should we make a vertical transaction before we face the person that wronged us? What must we address during the vertical transaction?
4. Why should we not say "I forgive you" to a person before they repent for the way they wronged us?
5. What are the differences and connections among forgiveness, reconciliation and conflict resolution?
6. Note the difference between forgiveness and re-establishing trust. Why is it that trust doesn't immediately follow forgiveness, or even reconciliation?
